TWIN FALLS GOLF ADVISORY COMMISSION MEETING

MINUTES

Chairperson Patty Lee called the meeting to order at 11:05am.

Item # 1 Approve minutes of the November 18th, 2009 meeting

A motion was made by Gary Roland to approve the November 18th, 2009 meeting minutes. Ray Wight seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Item #2 Review of Proposed Rate Changes

Recommendations were made at the November meeting to reduce the weekend/holiday rate to \$20 from \$23, increase cart storage from \$265 to \$300 in 2010 with yearly incremental increases of \$25 until 2014 and no longer accept new carts in the cart shed. City Staff would like the Commission to understand what effect their recommendations could have on the revenue for the course. There will be a potential loss of revenue by lowering the rate. Dennis compared the rounds of weekend/holiday play for the last three calendar years. In 2007 - 3338 rounds were played; 2008 - 3176; 2009 - 2406. If the same amount of rounds were played compared to the average the past three years, the City would decrease the revenue by \$8900 per year. The idea of reducing the rate was to generate additional weekend and/or holiday play. For the City to break even, 446 additional rounds would have to be played. Dennis went over the rates for all golf courses in the area.

Twin Falls Golf Club has the lowest weekend/holiday rates with the exception of Pleasant Valley in Kimberly.

He also went over the potential loss of the stored carts. Even though the price will increase each year for a storage fee, eliminating carts from the shed will decrease revenue. Ed commented he has talked with several people and even though the rates will increase for the storage of the carts, they will not remove their carts. He feels that eliminating the carts will not solve the problem. To get rid of the carts, he suggests adding a usage fee on all stored carts and to move the carts over to the #1 tee box cart shed.

Matt feels carts have a big effect on the quality of the course. If we aren't generating revenue from carts to put back into the course then we are falling behind. He suggested incorporating a trail fee from every vehicle (rental or private cart) that uses the course. We need to maximize the revenue from carts to go back into the course.

Dennis asked the Commission if they would like to make another recommendation or keep the previous one. He asked what they feel is more valuable – having City's equipment in a dry and secured place or a potential loss of revenue. Covers for the equipment was purchased for the equipment to keep them dry in the shed they are currently stored. Eventually that building will have to be torn down.

Greg doesn't think there will be a loss in revenue for at least a couple years. Ed asked what Mike thinks about raising the green fees to \$25 or keeping it at the current rate of \$23. Mike thinks that if people are going to play, they are going to pay. Ray agrees with City staff on keeping the green fees at \$23. He feels that by increasing the cart storage fee, it will encourage people who don't play that often to remove their cart and allow room for equipment. Mike agrees with Ed that we should probably be charging \$25 for weekend/holiday play. Everyone else is charging at least \$25 except Pleasant Valley. Gale commented that there is an advantage of being a couple dollars lower in price and we should leave the \$23 green fee alone. When fees were raised in the past, it didn't generate more rounds. Having a lower rate will hopefully bring more people to the course to play.

Patty made a motion to increase the cart storage as proposed originally. The Twin Falls Golf Club will not allow any more golf carts stored in the shed due to storing maintenance equipment in the cart shed. Existing carts can be stored with no replacements. Gary seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. A letter will be sent to all those that have a cart stored in the shed explaining what is planned for the future once Council approves the recommendation.

Ray made a motion to recommend to Council that the weekend and holiday green fees will remain the same at \$23. Ed seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Item #3 Logo Contest

Dennis reported that we received only one entry for the logo contest. Dennis asked if the Commission wants to accept this logo but change the leaves on the side to golf clubs. Gale made a motion to accept the proposed logo with golf clubs in place of the leaves on the logo. Ed seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. Dennis will get a proof of what the logo will look like with the golf clubs added. Dennis will present the logo to the City Council for their approval.

Item #4 Review of RFP on Management & Marketing of Tee Box Signs

Dennis informed the Commission that staff sent out a Request for Proposals for the management and marketing of tee box signs for the golf course. They received one proposal from the Bench Craft Company of Portland, Oregon. This company has met all the contract conditions the City requested but can't provide any revenue for the City. Dennis explained that the City is looking at selling ads for the tee box signs internally. They are also looking at doing this through the Parks and Recreation Department for advertising at the softball fields to generate extra revenue.

Gary mentioned that in the past the Men's Association had sold the advertising and asked when they stopped doing that. Dennis said it has been a couple years and the reason the City wants to take over the advertising is because the revenue from advertising on City facilities should go back to the City. Mike told the Commission the potential revenue to the City for advertising is approximately \$10,000 to \$12,000. Dennis explained that they have talked about using these funds to replace some of the old kitchen fixtures and appliances in the club house.

Mike reported he has talked to Pepsi about installing new signs on Grandview and the clubhouse. Pepsi agreed they would add a new sign on Grandview. Mike is talking with Lytle Signs about the sign on the club house and once he has the design and figures, he hopes Pepsi will also cover the cost on that.

Ed made a motion to reject the bid from the Bench Craft Company and have staff proceed with selling the ads for the tee box signs. Matt seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. Dennis will get the signs ordered and have staff start selling ads.

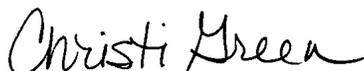
Item #5 Other Items from the Commission

Tom Burnikel presented to the Commission a marker for memorials at the golf course. He has met with Butte Fence and they designed a vinyl fence marker. Butte Fence will build it and donate it to the course at no cost. If someone wanted to purchase a small plaque, it can be attached to the fence for a small fee. Ed asked where the money would go. Tom said he doesn't know but assumes it would go to the City.

Dennis went over the donation policy that is in place for Parks and Recreation. There is an approved text that can be added to the plaque and anything additional has to be approved by the Parks and Recreation Commission. If this is something the Commission wants to implement, he would suggest having it set up like the Parks and Recreation Commission policy where the inscription has to be approved. Discussion followed. Dennis suggested forming a sub-committee to work on this project. Gary, Greg, Brett and Tom volunteered to serve on the sub-committee.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:22pm.

MINUTES

Chairperson Patty Lee called the meeting to order at 11:04am.

Item # 1 Approve minutes of the January 13th 2010 meeting

A motion was made by Gale Kleinkopf to approve the January 13th, 2010 meeting minutes. Brett Semple seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Item #2 Green Fees Waiver Request from Library Foundation

Diane Van Engelen requested that the Commission waive the green fees for the annual “Scramble fore Books” tournament sponsored by the Twin Falls Library Foundation Board. In the past, the tournament has had the green fees waived. This tournament is scheduled for Saturday, September 18, 2010.

Gale made a motion to approve the request from the Twin Falls Library Foundation Board to waive the green fees for the “Scramble fore Books” tournament. Ed Prater seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Item #3 Review of Recommendations to City Council

Dennis reported that Council approved of the proposed logo. Mike has not ordered the scorecards yet so he will get the new logo on them before they are printed. Council also approved of City staff managing and marketing the tee box signs. Council directed staff to seek outside help if they do not have the time and split the profit. Outside help could include the Men's Association and the Commission discussed asking them to help out now so we can get moving quickly with obtaining sponsors. The Commission agreed that having the Men's Association involved would be a big help and that they would be willing to jump in and help.

Item #4 Review of Stored Cart Fee Recommendation to City Council

A public hearing was held on Monday, February 8th on the Commission's recommendation of raising the stored cart fee. Council tabled the request. There is a lot of resistance with raising fees due to the economy. Mike mentioned that Tom and Travis told him to not accept any more new carts to store at the course at this time. The fees will remain the same until Council approves of the changes, but no more new carts will be allowed to be stored.

Item #5 PGA Professional Mike Hamblin's Report

Mike went over his report. He has been soliciting sponsors for the scorecards and has received 7 sponsors so far. The advertising for the front of the scorecard is now full but there are 10 spots available on the back of the card. He is hoping they will be printed and ready to go by March 1st.

So far 29 adult season passes, 22 senior season passes and 3 junior season passes have been sold for 2010. Mike mentioned the numbers will go up once the letters are sent out to those that store their carts at the course. In order to store a cart at the golf course, a season pass is required.

Mike went over the tournaments that are scheduled at the course that are exempt from green fees. CSI usually has a fundraiser tournament in May but they have not set a date yet, they are looking at the fall this year. Patty asked if a date has been set for the Annual Fundraiser Tournament. Mike said he will look over the schedule and will most likely use the same date as last year. If there is a conflict, he will let the Commission know.

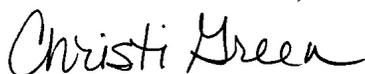
Item #6 Other Items from the Commission

Chairperson Patty Lee called the meeting to order at 11:06am.

Item # 1 Approve minutes of the February 10th, 2010 meeting

A motion was made by Gary Roland to approve the February 10th, 2010 meeting minutes. Brett Semple seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Item #2 Election of Officers

At the beginning of each year, the Commission can choose to elect new officers. Currently Patty Lee is the Chairperson and Ed Prater is the Vice-Chairperson. There is no limit on the years someone can serve as Chairperson or Vice-Chairperson.

Gary made a motion to re-appoint Patty Lee as Chairperson and Ed Prater as Vice-Chairperson. Gale seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Item #3 PGA Professional Mike Hamblin’s Report

Mike went over his report. The advertising on the scorecards have now been filled and he should have the new scorecards within 2 weeks. Season passes, as of March 1st, are as follows: Adults – 55, Seniors – 60 and Juniors – 13. Ed commented that he is surprised by the number of season passes sold for seniors. Mike informed the Commission that they made a list of the age of those that have paid for cart storage. There were 4 people that have a cart that was under the age of 60. The sheds should come open through attrition over the

course of time. As soon as we get reclaimed asphalt in the lower cart shed, we can start using that shed for storage.

A gas grill/oven was purchased from Blue Lakes Country Club for \$250. It works great. A new grill would cost approximately \$3800.00.

Dennis went over the financial report for the golf course. Overall, we are down \$51,000. If you take out the cost of the maintenance building, we are up \$9000. Mike is confident the golf course will make money this year if the weather cooperates. Ray asked if the numbers on the punch cards are down. Dennis said there is \$2000 more revenue this year compared to last year on punch card sales.

Item #4 Other Items from the Commission

Ed asked how the advertising for the tee boxes was going. Dennis informed the Commission that there hasn't been time for staff to call businesses for potential sponsorships. Greg discussed the idea of having the Men's Association start working on it. Brett updated the Commission on a conversation he had with Danny Hite, President of the Men's Association. The Men's Association has always sold the advertising in the past except for the last three years. If the City wants to keep 50% of the revenue or more, the Men's Association won't agree to help sell the advertising. Greg mentioned that Council did not set a percentage of what would be taken if staff needed to seek outside help. It was recommended for Dennis to contact Danny and see if they can set up a meeting to discuss an agreement for help with selling the advertising for the tee box signs.

Patty asked if a tee box sign can be donated for the Ladies' Association. The Ladies' Association painted the women's restroom at the golf course and Mastercraft donated a new corian countertop for the restroom. She would like to see a sign donated for their time in improving the restroom.

Dennis asked if the sub-committee has met on the donation policy of trees, etc. The sub-committee hasn't met yet but Brett will get some information out to them and we can have it on the agenda for the next meeting.

Patty brought up the Intercity Ladies' Tournament and waiving the green fees. She asked if it could be put on the consent calendar for Council's approval. Dennis explained that because it is not an agenda item, the Commission would have to make a motion to amend the agenda at the beginning of the meeting to vote on it. This item will be on the agenda for next month's meeting. Ray mentioned that the Commission needs to decide if waiving green fees needs to be discussed on a regular basis when the item is brought up or making it a rule of certain groups being able to have their green fees waived. Gale is concerned that waiving the green fees every time for certain groups could bring groups in that haven't had their fees waived in the past requesting them waived now.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:53am.

Item # 1 Approve minutes of the March 10th, 2010 meeting

Item #2 Green Fees Waiver Request – Ladies Association

The Inter-City tournament is scheduled for Thursday, September 30, 2010 at the Twin Falls Golf Club. There will be 40 ladies playing, five from each facility – Blue Lakes CC, Canyon Springs, Jerome CC, Clear Lakes CC, Rupert CC, Gooding CC, Burley CC and the Twin Falls Golf Club. These other courses waive the green fees when they host the tournament.

Patty Lee, representing the Inter-City tournament, requested the Commission waive the green fees for the Inter-City tournament on September 30, 2010.

Gale made a motion to waive the green fees for the Inter-City tournament on September 30, 2010. Brett seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Item #3 Green Fees Waiver Request – Golf Advisory Commission

For the past two years, the Golf Advisory Commission has requested from the City Council to waive the green fees for the fund raising tournament as all the money that has been raised is put back into the golf course. This year's tournament is scheduled for Saturday, July 31st.

Ed Prater made a motion to waive the green fees for the fund raising tournament. Gary Roland seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Dennis would like to present a list of the projects that will be done with this year's money to the Council. Mike would like to have the May meeting held at the golf course so the Commission can look at what projects should be done. Gale asked how much revenue is left over from the last tournament. Dennis will bring the numbers to the next meeting.

The Commission discussed different improvements they would like to see done at the course with the money raised from the tournament. Mike would like to have the cart path in between the grass and the parking lot re-paved. He received a bid for \$10,800 and was wondering if the Street Department would be able to do the work on it and save the City money. Greg thinks the Street Department contracts out for most of the asphaltting done in the City. Dennis and Greg will talk to Jackie Fields to see if it is something that can be done. Greg would like to add the re-seeding project into the budget and use the fund raiser tournament funds for things like new tee boxes, etc.

Item #4 Green Fees Waiver Request - CSI

This item was tabled until the next meeting when Joel Bate can attend.

Item #5 Donation Policy

Brett distributed and went over the donation policy he drafted to deal with requests from individuals that want to donate trees, benches or other amenities at the golf course. A copy will be e-mailed out to the Commission for their review.

Item #6 PGA Professional Mike Hamblin's Report

Mike went over his report. The scorecards have been printed and turned out really nice. Season passes that have been sold so far are as follows: Adults – 104, Seniors – 82, Juniors – 42, and College – 5.

Lines have been painted in the south cart shed to park the carts so they are all in line.

The 3rd Annual Twin Falls Golf Club Fundraiser tournament will be held on July 31st at 2:00pm. The format will be St. Louis Scramble. Mike suggested not raising the entry fee this year. Projects will be discussed at the next meeting.

Item #7 Other Items from the Commission

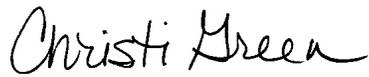

Chairperson Patty Lee called the meeting to order at 11:18am.

Item # 1 Approve minutes of the April 14th, 2010 meeting

A motion was made by Ray Wight to approve the minutes of the April 14th, 2010 meeting. Gale Kleinkopf seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Item #2 Fundraising Golf Tournament

Dennis informed the Commission that there is just over \$3900 left over from last year’s tournament. This can be used to repair the cart paths. Now that the weather is getting nice, they can start working on them.

Ray would like to get a list of names of sponsors that sponsored the tournament last year and have the Commission contact them for this year’s tournament. He feels a letter should be written to each one reminding them of the tournament and that someone from the Commission will be in contact with them. Brett suggested having a brochure made up of the projects we’ve done in the past and information of this year’s tournament and hand those out to people when trying to find sponsors. Patty asked if they will be doing a raffle again this year. The Commission feels it would be a good idea to obtain more sponsors. Last year, a season pass and driver was given away.

Mike went over some of the projects he would like to see done with this year’s tournament funds. These include: reseeding the fairways again, a large concrete driving range pad, rebuilding tee boxes #6, #11, #13,

#14, #17, and #18, repairs to cart paths, new tables and chairs in the clubhouse, phone and point of sale system and deep fryers. He would also like to repair the cart path to the east of the parking lot along the driving range. When the new maintenance shop was being built, the path got tore up because of the water line being added. This creates a safety issue. Mike is going to get a bid on repairing the cart path and see if the City will match the funds for the repair. The Commission discussed the different projects and what projects would be a priority.

After discussion, the Commission agreed that the funds for this year's tournament would be used to re-seed the fairways, re-build additional tee boxes and construct and improve the cart paths.

Dennis will submit the request of waiving the green fees for the fundraising tournament to City Council, along with the projects that will be done with the funds from the tournament.

Item #3 Review of Proposed Donation Policy

At the last meeting, Brett handed out a draft of the donation policy. An electronic copy was e-mailed to Commission members for their review. This policy is similar to the Parks and Recreation donation policy but is more specific to the golf course. Brett asked the Commission to review the policy and e-mail him with any changes.

The Commission discussed placing memorial plaques on the back of the scoreboard. This seems like the best place so the tee boxes don't get cluttered with plaques and everyone will be able to see them on the scoreboard.

Item #4 Green Fees Waiver Request

Dennis spoke with Joel Bate and he is out of town this week. In the past, the green fees have been waived for the annual "Fly Like An Eagle" tournament sponsored by the College of Southern Idaho. The tournament is scheduled for Saturday October 9th.

Gale made a motion to approve the request to waive the green fees for the "Fly Like An Eagle" tournament. Matt seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Item #5 PGA Professional Mike Hamblin's Report

This item was discussed in Item #2.

Item #6 Other Items from the Commission

Brett mentioned he has a draft of the proposal for the Men's Association written up. He will forward it on to Dennis.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:30pm.

Item # 1 Approve minutes of the May 12th, 2010 meeting

A motion was made by Brett Semple to approve the minutes of the May 12th, 2010 meeting. Ray Wight seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Item #2 Fundraising Golf Tournament

The Twin Falls Community Foundation approved the Twin Falls Golf Club's request that the Foundation be used as a funding mechanism of all entry fees, sponsors and donations.

Patty Lee made a motion to accept the donation policy as written. Ray Wight seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Dennis will forward the policy on to Fritz Wonderlich for his approval before presenting to Council for final approval. He also mentioned that Dario has been doing repairs to the scoreboard where the plaques will be placed.

Item #4 Discussion of Season Passes

For several years, the Commission and staff has discussed the price of season passes and how they relate to daily green fees. Some of the items that were discussed are: 1) How many rounds of golf should it take to make a season pass pay for itself? 2) Do we have the season passes consistent across the board as pertaining to daily green fees? 3) Do you look at the daily rates during the week, only on weekends or a combination of both? An analysis of daily green fees versus season passes and the number of rounds it takes to break even was included with the agenda packet.

City staff is not recommending a change in green fees or season passes at this time. They are recommending a sub-committee be formed to research this subject. Discussion followed from the Commission. They agree that this is a long term plan and a sub-committee should be formed. No sub-committee was formed at this time.

Item #5 PGA Professional Mike Hamblin's Report

Dennis went over Mike's report. The Twin Falls Golf Club will no longer be the home course for Filer High School Golf Team. At this time, there is no policy set up on payment for outlying schools to have a match at the course. Dennis will ask Mike what he would like to charge the schools that want to have matches at the course and have that recommendation at the next meeting.

Dennis went over the items that need to have the new name of the course on them. This would include pencils, signs, phone books, IGA and PGA. Scorecards have the new name on them. Dennis will check with the Street Department on the directional signs within the City to see if they can get those changed.

Dennis will work with Mike on the advertising for the \$1 golf.

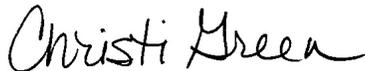
Item #6 Other Items from the Commission

Patty asked where the new boxes for broken tees came from. Mike said they bought some new ones and will be getting more.

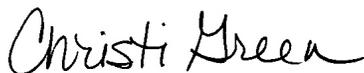
Mike informed the Commission that the computer system in the clubhouse had crashed and IS was able to get it back up and running. Mike has ordered a new system.

Greg will ask students from the Canyon Ridge golf team to set up the putting contest.

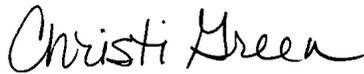

Mike would like the Commission to start thinking about the rates for next year.

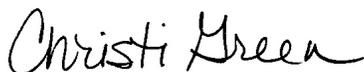
Classifications 4A and 5A High school golf will most likely be changed to the fall for 2012.

Patty suggested that there might be some snow birds that have bought punch cards with punches left on them and they could donate them to the senior center.

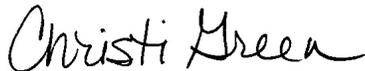
Item #5 Other Items from the Commission

Vice-Chairperson Ed Prater called the meeting to order at 11:00am.

Item # 1 Approve minutes of the September 8th, 2010 meeting

A motion was made by Gale Kleinkopf to approve the minutes of the September 8th, 2010 meeting. Brett Semple seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Item #2 Fundraising Golf Tournament Update

Dennis informed the Commission that so far everyone has paid on the fundraiser except for PSI. Greg will call them again to see why they haven't paid. Ray mentioned that he has left everyone on the board that has supported the fundraiser two out of the three years. So far, there is approximately \$2,400 left over and two more bills that came in to make a deficit of approximately \$4,100. Mike has talked to Travis Rothweiler about having the City cover that cost and having the fundraiser pay the City back next year. Travis was ok with that.

Mike would like to get First Federal Savings on board as a title sponsor for next year's tournament. Ray and Mike will get a letter written and meet with First Federal this week. Mike also mentioned that IGA has come out with their calendar of events for next year. He asked the Commission if they would like the tournament

to be the same date as last year and if they would want to pay \$5 to get the tournament on the IGA schedule. The Commission agreed that they will have the tournament the same time as last year and have it added to the IGA schedule.

Terry McCurdy, Chairman of the Twin Falls Community Foundation, introduced himself to the Commission and gave a brief history of the foundation. This year, the foundation has charged the Golf Tournament a 5% service charge in the amount of \$412.50. Terry explained that they have not done this in the past and need to cover their expenses. He apologized to the Commission for not letting them know the fee was going to be assessed this year. He said that the Foundation is willing to work out something with the Commission for the mis-understanding. They want to continue working with the Commission each year on the tournament. The Commission decided to table this item and will discuss at the next Commission meeting if they will continue using the foundation in the future.

Lorie Race, City of Twin Falls Chief Finance Officer, explained to the Commission that it is in the best interest of the City to continue using the Community Foundation. The City Manager does not want soliciting for donations from a government agency and those donations coming into a government agency. Lorie also mentioned that if the Foundation is charging a fee to cover expenses that they should be doing the accounting as well. Dennis and Lorie will get together and come up with a solution of the best way to handle the finances and accounting of the tournament.

Item #3 Filer High School Golf Team

At the June meeting, a discussion was held on what to charge the Filer High School Golf Team. Mike and Greg were both absent at that meeting so no history of past charges were discussed. Mike said in the past, the Men's Association paid the surcharges for the team. Filer is practicing at Pebble Ponds but Mike does not know if they will be using Twin Falls Golf Club. He received a call from a coach and he told them that if they want to have a tournament at the course, they will need to send a request for the Commission to approve. Mike hasn't received anything yet. Dennis suggested having the Commission set a policy for outside schools and set a fee, and then Mike can let them know what dates are available. Mike will contact Filer High School and see what their plan is this year. The Commission asked staff to put this on the agenda for the next meeting discussion concerning non Twin Falls School District golf teams using the golf course.

Item #4 Discounted Passes at Costco

Mike was asked by a manager at Costco about a month ago to sell passes for Twin Falls Golf Club. They would like to sell punch cards. Typically Costco wants a 20% discount. Jaker's sold \$100 gift cards at Costco for \$80 and did very well. Mike asked him for more details so he could present to the Commission but hasn't heard back from him.

Item #5 Season Pass vs. Daily Green Fees

The Commission discussed the issue of season passes vs. daily green fees at a previous meeting. Some of the items that were discussed are: 1) How many rounds of golf should it take to make a season pass pay for itself? 2) Have the season passes consistent across the board as pertaining to daily green fees, and 3) Do you look at the daily rates during the week, or only on weekends or a combination of both of them?

A spreadsheet with the daily prices and season passes of other courses in southern Idaho and their analysis of daily prices vs. season pass prices including Twin Falls Golf Club was e-mailed to the Commission for

review. Staff would like the Commission to form a sub-committee to review these spreadsheets in detail and come back to the Commission with a recommendation.

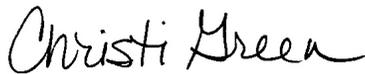
Gale and Brett volunteered to serve on the sub-committee.

Item # 1 Approve minutes of the November 10th, 2010 meeting

A motion was made by Ray Wight to approve the minutes of the November 10th, 2010 meeting. Gale Kleinkopf seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Item #2 Twin Falls Community Foundation

At the last meeting, the Commission tabled the discussion of using Twin Falls Community Foundation for the 2011 golf tournament fund-raiser. Dennis informed the Commission that it would be in the Commission's best interest to use the foundation because City staff felt it would be best if the donations would not go through the City accounting. Gale also expressed his opinion that the Commission should continue using the foundation because the cost to set up a foundation for the golf course with the IRS, insurance, etc would be over \$2000. The Commission discussed having the foundation take care of the invoicing and accounting of the fund-raiser. They would like to see the communication between the foundation and the Commission improve next year. Dennis will contact Terry McCurdy and let him know that the Commission will be using them again next year.

Item #3 Non Twin Falls School District Golf Teams Use of Course Policy

At the last meeting, it was discussed to have a policy for non Twin Falls School District Golf teams to use the course. Mike and Dennis met and discussed the policy. They recommend that the Commission adopt the following policy:

- A. Non Twin Falls School District golf teams must schedule their tournament(s) thru Twin Falls Golf Club's Golf Pro at least two weeks in advance.
- B. Request must be in written form or email.
- C. The fees are the current daily green fees for juniors.
- D. The fees are to be paid by the day of the meet.

The Commission agrees that the recommended policy be put in place.

Item #4 Sub-Committee Report on Season Pass vs. Daily Green Fees

The sub-committee, consisting of Gale and Brett, along with Mike and Dennis met on November 29th to discuss and review the fees. They have a proposed policy in place but the sub-committee will have to meet with the City's Finance Department to discuss the proposed changes and how it would affect the overall revenue at the golf course before a recommendation can be made.

The sub-committee felt it would be best to form a policy in which the season passes are tied into the daily green fees. When the daily green fees are adjusted, the season passes are adjusted accordingly.

The proposed policy is:

- A. The season pass is 30 times the cost of a weekday green fee.
- B. The couple's (adult & senior) season pass is a 30% discount of two passes.
- C. The add-on for each child to an adult's or couple's season pass is ½ the cost of a season pass for juniors.

Discussion followed. The Commission is fine with the direction the sub-committee is going with the policy. Dennis will have more information for the Commission after meeting with the Finance Committee. This item will be on the agenda for the next meeting.

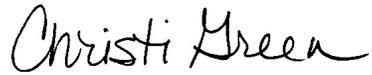
Item #5 Other Items from the Commission
