



### AUGER FALLS HERITAGE PARK

Auger Falls Heritage Park was established by the City of Twin Falls in 2001 to provide the public with nearby opportunities for hiking, mountain biking, birding, or an escape from the office.

With more than 20 miles of trails and 640 acres along the Snake River, the park provides the perfect setting to relax and unwind. Amenities include hiking, mountain biking, restrooms.

*Park rules: No motorized vehicles. Dogs must be on leash at all times.*



### CENTENNIAL PARK

Enjoy kayaking, paddle boarding, canoeing, and boating, as well as hiking, fishing and rock climbing. Park amenities include: equipment rentals, launches and docks for motorized and non-motorized boats, trails, shelters with BBQ, and event pavilions available for rent.



### I.B. PERRINE BRIDGE

Completed in 1976, the 'Gateway to Twin Falls' spans 1,500 feet in length and rises 486 feet above the floor of the Snake River Canyon. The bridge is a popular destination for BASE jumpers from around the world, as it is the only bridge of its kind that allows year-round BASE jumping without a permit.



### PILLAR FALLS

This scenic falls is popular for its unique beauty and as a stopping point for kayakers, paddle boarders, and canoeists on their way to Shoshone Falls.

### TWIN FALLS VISITOR CENTER

Located near the I.B. Perrine Bridge, the Visitor Center offers a wealth of information about scenic routes and locations, recreation opportunities in southern Idaho, regional events and festivals, and unique souvenirs.



### EVEL KnieVEL JUMPSITE

The world-famous daredevil Evel Knievel attempted to fly his sky cycle across the Snake River Canyon from this location on Sept. 8, 1974. The earthen ramp is the last remnant of a massively popular event that was televised around the world. Walking and bicycle trail access 1/8 miles from jumpsite - no vehicle access.



### CANYON RIM TRAIL

Stay on the trail. Motorized vehicles are prohibited. Pedestrians have right-of-way. Dogs must be on a leash at all times. Please do not disturb rocks, plants, animals.
